- 7. Mayor’s Monthly Report

Mayor introduced a group of people who represents our community very well especially in issues of character, commitment, and being involved in so many ways that makes us proud in our town. This young group here tonight are the Girl Scouts who are celebrating their 95th Anniversary this spring. The Girl Scouts here tonight are from Troop 4140 with their leader Dottie Hewes and comprised of fourth through sixth graders. The Mayor invited the group to come to the front of the room and then read and presented the leader with a Proclamation in honor of this occasion.

Mayor is very pleased with the ice skating rink with so many families taking advantage of the rink especially on weekends. It started off slow with the warmer weather at the beginning of the season but ended up great with the colder weather that set in. He thanked all of the parents for bringing their children down. Mayor gave kudos to the Senior Center, their staff and Jim Goggin for the wonderful Corn Beef Dinner last week.

Mayor was extremely pleased with the meeting on February 24th regarding Renaissance Place especially with the questions from this Board and the members of the Naugatuck Economic Development Corporation. Mayor commended all of the burgesses for their leadership on this issue. Since an election is coming up shortly the Mayor has invited all three of the mayoral candidates to a meeting to go through the Development Agreement thoroughly so that they could ask any questions that they need answers to. A public forum is tentatively set for March 28th at the High School where citizens will get a chance to bring forth questions.

The Development Agreement, HMA and Executive Summary is posted on line. It is also available at the library. Mayor would like all of the citizens of Naugatuck to review this document and be informed to make an intelligent vote in May. WHEREAS, the Borough of Naugatuck (the “Borough”) has an interest in encouraging and enabling the revitalization and redevelopment of the Borough and its immediate environment, and in stimulating substantial economic development and corresponding increased job creation and tax revenues to the Borough;

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to stimulate the redevelopment of downtown Naugatuck through public improvements within the downtown Naugatuck area which will further aid the area’s revitalization;

WHEREAS, Renaissance Place LLC (“Renaissance”) wishes to undertake a development program in downtown Naugatuck in multiple phases to revitalize Naugatuck’s downtown center and related areas for various uses, including, but not limited to, market rate housing, entertainment, recreation, retail, medical, technology, industry, energy creation, office and other compatible uses (the “Renaissance Place Project”);

WHEREAS, the Borough, the Naugatuck Economic Development Corporation (“NEDC”), and Renaissance entered into a Pre-Development Agreement dated June 16, 2004 for the purpose of developing conceptual plans for the Renaissance Place Project and providing for the negotiation of a development agreement regarding the development of the Renaissance Place Project;

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2005, the Board of Mayor and Burgesses (the “Board”) adopted an ordinance designating NEDC as either (i) its development agency under the provisions of Chapter 132 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, and/or (ii) its redevelopment agency under the provisions of Chapter 130 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, members of NEDC and other officials of the Borough have expended considerable time and effort to negotiate a development agreement with Renaissance;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby RESOLVED,

(1) That the Borough enter into a development agreement by and among the Borough, NEDC and Renaissance (the “Agreement”) in form substantially similar to the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A, subject to a majority of the electors of the Borough voting “Yes” at a non-binding referendum to be held on May 7, 2007 on the question set forth below; and

(2) That the Agreement is hereby approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to execute and deliver the Agreement in the name of the Borough, subject to a majority of the electors of the Borough voting “Yes” at a non-binding referendum to be held on May 7, 2007 on the question approved below; and

(3) That upon the execution of the Agreement, the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to take such actions necessary or appropriate to perform the obligations of the Borough contemplated by the Agreement; and

(4) That upon the execution of the Agreement, the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to enforce the rights, benefits and privileges of the Borough under the Agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to submit the following question to a non-binding vote of the electors of the Borough to be held on Monday, May 7, 2007, between the hours of 6:00 a.m., and 8:00 p.m., for yes or no vote, in designated voting locations in the manner provided by the Charter of the Borough and the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, under the following heading:

SHALL THE BOROUGH OF NAUGATUCK PURSUE THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PROPOSED RENAISSANCE PLACE PROJECT BY ENTERING INTO A DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE DEVELOPER, RENAISSANCE PLACE LLC, AND THE NAUGATUCK ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION?

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby authorizes the preparation and printing of explanatory text in accordance with Section 9-369b of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, for the question to be voted upon on May 7, 2007 approved above. Subject to the approval of the municipal attorney of the Borough, the Board further authorizes the preparation and printing of materials concerning the question to be voted upon on May 7, 2007 approved above in addition to the explanatory text in accordance with Section 9-369b of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, the Burgesses and other proper officers of the Borough are authorized to take all other actions which are necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of the foregoing resolutions.

16. Discussion/possible action on recommendation of the Solar Committee Report to have a solar roof put on Naugatuck High School and send this question to May election.
Burgess Neth handed out an Existing Conditions Report and pictures from Kaestle Boos Associates, Inc. of the High School roof . The cost analysis including a new roof and installation of a solar system would be a 5.7 million dollar project but with the state reimbursement the town would only have to pay 1 million twenty-six thousand. Payback conservatively would be between 7 and 9 years. There will be a public hearing regarding this project. It was suggested that a special referendum take place after the May Election.

Mart has donated \$1,000. to our Fire Department under the Community Grant Program. This is the third such donation in this last year.

One of the concerns the Fire Commission has is they feel we need a town garage for better maintenance of Borough equipment. The reason the Fire Department equipment is rotting out quickly is because there is no way to wash the under carriage of the vehicles. This Board should consider looking for a facility for not only the fire trucks but street equipment such as plow trucks and garbage trucks. It is something for us to think about for the future. The Chief and Commission are working on a replacement package explaining what vehicles will be needed in the next five or ten years. The committee is almost finished working on their plans for the testing of new firefighters. They are taking a long hard look at the process and will present it to the Boro. possibly next month. The Arts Commission is working diligently towards sponsorship of some great programs this coming summer along with the concerts. They do a great job with the little funding they have. Inquired about the update on Peter J. Foley Parking Lot. Waiting for answers from Attorney Botelho on questions she asked at the meeting. She would like a copy of what was changed on the Development Agreement. We still have to put the fuel tanks on the agenda for discussion. Burgess Fragoso stated that this Board was never against not sending Renaissance Place to referendum. She hopes the public goes to the meeting to ask questions so they can be comfortable, informed, and open-minded with their vote. She considers this the most important vote this Board has ever had to make.

-Burgess Burns asked Mayor to look into the qualifications of person who asked to go on Inland Wetlands. Thinks commission openings should be put in the newspaper.

-Deputy Mayor Rossi reminded everyone about Marge Findlay's Fund Raiser on the 21st Contributions can be made if you cannot attend. The Community Champions Dinner sponsored by the Naugatuck Exchange Club will be held on Wednesday, March 14th at the Continental Room. She congratulated this year's recipients for all of the good work they have done in our community.

Renaissance Place is the future of this town. Burgess Rossi hopes the public will educate themselves because it is such an important decision to be made. It is such an important vote for everyone to participate in. She brought up an issue with a pizza restaurant on Cherry Street. The traffic is such with people picking up pizzas that a fire truck would have a difficult time getting up Cherry Street. Something has to be done before someone gets hurt. Suggested that the Police Department start ticketing cars. There is a parking lot behind the business. The island where people pull in is owned by the State.

-Burgess Neth congratulated Mr. Frank Johnson on his induction into the Veterans Hall of Fame. He certainly is deserving of that accolade. Regarding the parking lot at Peter J. Foley, this property is vital to the existence and continuation

of Peter J. Foley. Without that Parking Lot, the league would be out of business. It is probably the oldest and nicest Little League in New England.

Questioned why there wasn't any Family Service report this month. Asked about an update on the tables in the Hall of Burgesses. Congratulated Frank Johnson and all the recipients to be honored at the Champions Dinner.

-Burgess Campbell congratulated Burgess Neth and his committee for their work relating to the solar system for the High School. Believes this should be done. Would like to see the questions and answers regarding Renaissance Place on line.
