7. Mayor's Monthly Report

Mayor attended the St. Patrick's Day Dinner at the Senior Center and enjoyed celebrating the holiday. He gave kudos to Tax Collector Jim Goggin for his annual contribution of cooking the corned beef and cabbage for the Senior Center. The Hibernians held their annual event at the Historical Society having the Irish Dancers perform and paying tribute to the Irish Mayors of the day, Joseph Scully and Mary Sullivan.

The Naugatuck High School DECA Chapter held a fundraiser basketball game between the students and the faculty and the Mayor was honored to be the honorary coach for the students. There were 500 people in attendance and they raised \$3,100. for the Dana Farber Institute. The Mayor thanked everyone who made this event successful.

The Mayor attended the Exchange Club annual Community Champions Dinner and was part of the forum He congratulated Bryan Coney, Dan Ford, Cathy Tamowski and Maria DaLuz Vinagre on their deserving awards.

Mayor Bronko commended our Zoning Commission for all of their work in creating the Special Development District regulations. It took many long hours and special meetings to accomplish this difficult feat. This document now allows the Renaissance Place Project to move forward as well as keep the best interest of the Borough.

It was the Mayor's pleasure to travel with Meals on Wheels sponsored by New Opportunities of Waterbury and help deliver meals to residents who need assistance this past week. He believes it is a fantastic program.

Mayor announced the State has begun its Environmental Impact Evaluation for Renaissance Place. A meeting was held at the High School allowing for public comment and it is estimated that by early December, we can expect a complete document from the State.

The Peter J. Foley Parking Lot contract has been executed and the town will be making improvements to this site we have been waiting so long for. There are also plans to move the recycling center off of Rubber Avenue to a new site and this will open up major opportunities for redevelopment along Rubber Avenue. Mayor Bronko attended a ribbon cutting ceremony at the McDonalds on New Haven Road for its new McCafe. They donated \$100.00 to the Mayor's Office for a charity of his choice. He will be donating this money to Naugatuck High School Grad Nite.

The Mayor has directed the Zoning Enforcement Officer to contact different businesses that have been posting advertisements on public property throughout our town to remove them. It is not only unsightly, but it is against a town ordinance and there is a safety issue for the utility companies who own the poles. Hopefully, all posters will be removed soon.

Mayor reported that he was working with the I.T. Department to develop a new page on the Borough website that will allow the Mayor to keep residents updated

-Burgess Fragoso stated the Arts Commission have all of their concerts line up for the summer program and this will be announced in the newspaper. They have scheduled three bucket nights where people can make a donation to the Arts commission and this is used for scholarships to our Naugatuck students. They will also be collecting items for our local food bank at the concerts. A puppet show will be presented at our local schools (relating to bullying) sponsored by the Arts Commission.
