General Paving Information

When is my road scheduled to be repaved?

The Borough Department of Public Works maintains a five year proposed paving plan. The plan is tentative and changes due to available funding from the Borough and State as well as proposed utility work in the area. The paving schedule can be viewed on the Boroughs website. www.naugatuck-ct.gov

The Public Works Department schedules paving operations twice yearly during the Spring and Fall. A more detailed schedule is provided on the website as your road nears paving.

How are roads scheduled to be paved?

Roads are scheduled to be paved based on several factors including:

- 1) Road surface condition
- 2) Road classification
- 3) Proposed underground utility work
- 4) Drainage issues
- 5) Available funding
- 6) Location

How long will paving take?

Normally milling and paving a single road can be completed in two days, one day for milling and one day for paving. Due to weather and scheduling issues there is normally a period of time where vehicles must travel over milled and unpaved roads. Motorists must use extreme caution during this time due to the raised structures in the roadway.

Milling and Paving for the season normally takes weeks to complete.

Will I have access to the road during paving?

The Department of Public Works will do everything possible to maintain access for residents during paving. Major roadways will be maintained with alternating one-way traffic while secondary road will be closed to through traffic.

Can I park on the street during paving?

No on street parking is permitted during paving. Parked cars in marked areas will be towed at the owner's expense. Parking will be allowed when paving is completed.

Can I leave my property during paving?

If residents need to leave their property during paving operation they should do so before paving train reaches there home.

Will my driveway be impacted?

Driveways that are damaged during milling or paving will be repaired by the DPW. If the new paving causes additional runoff down driveways a driveway apron will be installed.

Will the road get new curbing after paving;

Generally curbing will not be added to locations that did not have curbing before paving. Curbing is replaced along street on a case by case basis depending on the condition of the curb.

What if I have concerns regarding the proposed paving in my area?
