Sometimes I got to wear her genuine imitation pearls and white nylon party gloves that had little ruffles at the cuff. With the sweet scent of perfume in the air, and a twirl of my party dress, I entered a tea party world. These tea parties were held in my grandmother’s kitchen. We would sit at her round, grey formica topped kitchen table, that was covered with her favorite white embroidered table cloth. At the center of the table was a vase of just picked Lily of the Valleys, little jingle bells of sweet smelling white flowers with emerald green foliage. Joining us at the table were my purple teddy bear, a Raggedy Anne doll, and my Barbie Doll. Grandmother would serve her homemade vanilla sugar cookies and Italian fruit bar cookies. Together we would arrange at the table folded cloth napkins, polished silver spoons, and a set of real glass tea cups. They were actually my Grandmother’s old china, but for me they were china cups and plates fit for a royal princess. As a child, the tea held in my floral decorated teapot was actually pure apple juice. I sipped it slowly. Grandmother would also sip on our apple juice tea and tell me stories of her childhood. As I politely nibbled on the sweet cookies, I listened to the dear lady, telling me that when she was a child her hair color was the exact dark brown shade as mine. She would say that I took after her side of the family, and that’s where I got my talented gifts. I adored those lovely, special tea party moments with my gracious grandmother. We had a great time together.”

Rachel continues to remark, “I am now planning another great time together for members of the Naugatuck Senior Center. It will be a picture perfect tea party to be held at The Village at East Farms. I am working with Chef Leon Newman, our Executive Chef, and together we are coordinating a delicious tea party, complete with scones topped with clotted cream and strawberry jam. After the tea I will host a tour of The Village at East Farms. You just may meet some of your former Naugatuck neighbors on the tour who now call The Village their home. See you there! I’ll be the one wearing the black patent leather dress shoes!”

The Connecticut Statewide Respite Program offers daytime or overnight relief for caregivers of individuals with Alzheimer’s or related dementias. The task of caring for a person with dementia is overwhelming. Family caregivers often develop stress related illnesses such as heart disease, hypertension, or ulcers. An occasional break allows an exhausted caregiver to regroup, both physically and emotionally, and to find the strength to carry on.

The Connecticut Statewide Respite Care Program is funded by the State Department of Social Services and is operated in partnership with the Alzheimer’s Association Chapters of Connecticut and the Connecticut Area Agencies on Aging. The program offers caregivers the opportunity to receive an assessment of services needed and have a care plan developed and/or purchase services for the individual with dementia. Eligible families may apply for daytime or overnight respite care services including: Adult day care, home health aide, homemaker/companion, skilled nursing care or short term nursing care. CODE OF CONDUCT

The Naugatuck Senior Center is a facility where people age 50 and older meet for the purpose of participating in social, recreational, educational and support service activities in order to enhance and enrich their lives. Seniors have the right to expect their peers to act respectfully towards them and they have the responsibility to act respectfully towards their peers.

Seniors must conduct themselves appropriately, treat each other with courtesy and respect, and cooperate at all times in order to create a positive environment and sense of community within the Senior Center facility.

Any senior who chooses not to adhere to this Conduct will be deemed to be in violation of the policy. In any such occurrence, the Director of the Senior Center will make the determination of any action to be taken, to preclude recurrence.

We believe:

Older adults are individuals of dignity and self-worth with ambitions, capabilities and creative capacities; older adults seek continued growth and development; older adults need both access to sources of information and help for personal and family problems as well as opportunities to learn from individuals coping with similar problems; older adults have the freedom to voice their input regarding the center programming.
