

**MINUTES
REGULAR MEETING
BOARD OF MAYOR AND BURGESSES
MAY 6, 2025**

The Borough of Naugatuck held the Board of Mayor and Burgesses meeting on a hybrid basis. Everyone was welcomed to attend in person, by Zoom Webinar or by phone.

1. Mayor “Pete” Hess called the regular meeting to order at **7:02 p.m.** with the following in attendance:

2. Burgess Charles Marenghi led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.
3. **VOTED:** Unanimously on a motion by Deputy Mayor Vitale and seconded by Burgess Rosenblatt that the Board of Mayor and Burgesses approve the minutes of the regular meeting of **April 1, 2025**. Each member received a copy for review.
4. **VOTED:** Unanimously on a motion by Deputy Mayor Vitale and seconded by Burgess Rosenblatt that the Board of Mayor and Burgesses approve the monthly reports of **April**. Each member received copies for review.
5. Mayor’s Opening Comments
Mayor Hess said there will be a special meeting on May 27th with a presentation by G&W Railroad.
6. Public Comment – Open Topic – None
7. Chief Kyle Kelley gave the monthly update on the **Naugatuck Ambulance Corps (NAC)**. He provided the board with a written monthly report. Thomaston is being lent an ambulance. NAC is interviewing EMTs and paramedics. A new ambulance should be delivered in a few weeks. Materials were donated for a carport. It will cost \$35,000 to build. There will be CPR training classes two days during EMS Week. Everyone is welcome to attend.

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8. Mayor Hess discussed **Borough of Naugatuck Downtown Stabilization/Incentive Grants**. The TIF (Tax Incremental Financing) Committee will set up the criteria, procedures and applications. Their next meeting will be held on May 19th.
9. Mayor Hess said the **Façade Improvement Subcommittee** is finalizing the application process.
10. There is a new part-time position in the budget for the senior center. Burgess Gallo and Burgess Rosenblatt, who are on the **Senior Center Activity Committee**, are looking at programs and activities for the senior center with Senior Center Director Harvey Frydman. They will try to get programs of interest to younger seniors.
11. The **Borough of Naugatuck Development Plans** are on schedule. Mayor Hess said most of Church Street will be done by June. The Infrastructure Project is Church Street then the green, Maple Street and the Maple Street Bridge. Everything should be completed by October. He was asked if Church Street would be ready for the Memorial Day Parade. The mayor said probably not because the road needs a first coat then a second coat of asphalt. We want it to be done properly. The CT Community Challenge Project is moving along on Water Street, Old Firehouse Road, the new road and a small portion of Rubber Avenue. There are issues with Eversource on Water Street and Rubber Avenue.
12. The **Fiscal Year 2025/2026 Budget/Townwide Facility Reorganization Plan**. Mayor Hess said they developed a well-balanced plan that helps education a lot. The plan reduces the mill rate and increases services.
13. **VOTED:** Unanimously on a motion by Deputy Mayor Vitale and seconded by Burgess Rosenblatt that the Board of Mayor and Burgesses approve the reappointment of **Kevin Gendron, Jr. (U)**, 50 Rayon Circle, Naugatuck, CT 06770 as a regular landlord commissioner of the **Fair Rent Commission**, term to expire May 1, 2029.
14. **VOTED:** Unanimously on a motion by Deputy Mayor Vitale and seconded by Burgess Rosenblatt that the Board of Mayor and Burgesses authorize Mayor Hess to sign all contracts and related documents for the **road acceptance of Barnum Court** as a borough accepted and maintained road.
15. Mayor Hess discussed the need for a **Displaced Persons Relocation Plan and Policy**. He said it is state law that municipalities need to assist residents displaced, if the fire marshal or building inspector deems the building unsafe. The borough created a policy that outlines a procedure to follow and provides housing while limiting the amount the borough spends. Heather Mueller, building department secretary, will be the relocation coordinator. The policy gives the borough the ability to cap the maximum amount given to displaced residents. Without a policy, they can challenge the borough to continue to provide housing.

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VOTED: Unanimously on a motion by Deputy Mayor Vitale and seconded by Burgess Rosenblatt that the Board of Mayor and Burgesses adopt the document entitled “**Borough of Naugatuck Relocation Plan**” as the borough policy to deal with relocations under the Uniform Relocation Act in the Connecticut General Statutes.

WHEREAS, Connecticut fair housing laws require that all individuals, regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, marital status, age, lawful source of income, familial status, learning disability, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity or expression be given equal access to all housing-related opportunities, including rental and home ownership opportunities, and be allowed to make free choices regarding housing location; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Naugatuck is committed to upholding these laws, and realizes that these laws must be supplemented by an Affirmative Statement publicly endorsing the right of all people to full and equal housing opportunities in the neighborhood of their choice; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Naugatuck hereby endorses a Fair Housing Policy to ensure equal opportunity for all persons to rent, purchase, obtain financing and enjoy all other housing-related services of their choice on a non-discriminatory basis as provided by state and federal law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the chief executive officer of the Borough of Naugatuck or his designated representative is responsible for responding to and assisting any person who alleges to be the victim of an illegal discriminatory housing practice in the Borough of Naugatuck and for advising such person of the right to file a complaint with the State of Connecticut Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities (CHRO) or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) or to seek assistance from the CT Fair Housing Center, legal services, or other fair housing organizations to protect his or her right to equal housing opportunities.
